


FINDING AND DEVELOPING INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS

For most children and youth in foster care, and through no fault of their own, they are denied this right. Untreated trauma, unstable living conditions, and a lack of familial support result in a profoundly negative trajectory for these young people:



Our donors believe that young people from foster care have the right to safe and stable housing


After stays in shelters, foster care, and group homes, Monika is now receiving support through StepStones' housing programs and, this past summer, celebrated a birthday in her first apartment.

StepStones' Safe at Home Project connects children and youth with kith, kin, and community allies who provide long-term, stable home environments and unconditional care and support. Connection Coordinators assist young people identify adults with whom they have pre-existing relationships such as extended family members or neighbors and mentors. Long-term housing and supportive networks of adults help youth achieve their educational goals, improve their mental health, and increase their sense of belonging and community.

StepStones' Housing Grants and Support Project offers young people assistance with critical housing-related activities and expenses. Emergency subsidies help youth maintain rental payments while they focus on school and career objectives. Connection Coordinators help youth meet their basic needs, locate safe and appropriate housing, move into and obtain necessities for their new homes, and build positive relationships with property owners.

YOUTH MENTOR CONNECTIONS PROGRAM

Our donors understand the important role of supportive adults in the lives of young people from foster care



Max was commissioned to create StepStones' holiday cards, a first in his life as a young artist, which is now an idea he would like to explore, along with getting into piloting school with the help of Michael, his wonderful mentor and biggest fan.

StepStones' Youth Mentor Connections Project matches young people with one-to-one, volunteer mentors who provide support for education and mental health, guidance for positive life choices, and opportunities to develop healthy and meaningful relationships. Mentors become substitute family members youth can trust and with whom they can share problems and celebrate successes. By nurturing genuine and trusting relationships with a mentor through initial welcoming activities in the youths' areas of interest, a unique foundation for success is created.

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YOUTH ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM

Working in solidarity with young people who have lived experience in the foster care and child welfare systems, all of our programming and processes are informed by their voices, suggestions, and visions. This year our donors helped us provide exciting and essential skill development through virtual workshops in cooking and nutrition, financial literacy, yoga and mindfulness, and arts and expression. Our inspiring Youth Advisory and Social Committees brought young people together to share their experiences, make suggestions for programming, create awareness campaigns, and strengthen our community.
